This document aims to establish a common, pragmatic, and coherent narrative for natural gas as a key enabler of sustainable energy systems and social development in the region.

This White Paper is a sequel to the document "<u>Natural Gas in the Transition to</u> <u>Low-Carbon Economies – The Case for Latin America and the Caribbean</u>," which was issued in 2023 as a joint effort among IGU, ARPEL, OLADE and counted on the support of the national gas associations of the region and other key stakeholders. This first document established a broad understanding of the role of natural gas in the region; it made a significant impact, and was presented in diverse fora around the globe as a contribution to the international energy dialogue.
